### HISTORY OF THE INSTITUTION

The College derives its name from SWAMI PREMANAND- a saint and philosopher of the modern times. He has been a great force in pioneering the religious sentiments in the second and third quarter of the past century. The essential spirit of Swamiji's message lays emphasis upon the need to eradicate ignorance and dogmatic beliefs which had for centuries crippled the human mind. So it was thought appropriate by the people of the area to raise an educational institution in the memory of this enlightened son of God who met with a fatal accident on 23rd April, 1965 at Mukerian.

The sudden and sad demise of this great saint, though an irreparable loss to the cause of humanity proved to be an ultimate boon for the people of the area. It became stimulant for the opening of a temple of learning where the darkness of ignorance could be shed and the spark of knowledge could be ignited in the minds of the heirs of nation's destiny. No better homage could be paid to noble soul who has raised a forceful voice against old superstitious ideas. His life had been spent in the service of mankind and in the service of God. Swamiji travelled all over the world to share his experience and to uplift and awaken humanity.

LATE SH. B.N MAKKAR, the founder Life President of S.P.N. College Mukerian, left for his heavenly abode on 12-4-1998. He started the project of opening his college, with the active co-operation of the people of this area and finally succeeded in founding it in 1971. Founder President Late Sh. B.N MAKKAR always identified himself with the youthful aspirations among the college managing committee, staff and the students. He was born on 18th October, 1924 at Mukerian, Distt. Hoshiarpur. He was a person of versatile qualities. He spent the better part of his life in the service of mankind. He was a bold speaker and organizer. It made him lovable to one and all. He was a leading public man and an eminent educationist of the area. The coming generations shall remember him for years to come. During the span of these 46 years, the college has grown into a splendid temple of higher education and is now counted among the leading institutions of the state. Its achievements in academic, cultural and sports sphere have been consistently outstanding for these years. The credit for all this goes to our beloved President Sh. B.N. Makkar, who left us all in tears.

During 46 years, managing committee, principals and the staff of S.P.N. College contributed a lot to the expansion and progress of the institution. In the beginning, the college had five class rooms and the student strength was less than four hundred. But the college continued making a tremendous progress every year. The present number of 50 class rooms, administration block, a big separate library building, a big student centre, a computer centre, parent-cum-visitor room, management conference room, communication skill lab, fully equipped projector rooms and fully equipped laboratories have given the college a new shape now. As a result of the combined efforts, the number of students in the college has swelled to about 1700. It is a rare achievement of our rare institution.



## COLLEGE CAMPUS


The College campus has come to wear a new and better look with the recent additions and alterations made to its premises. The library building with its two huge, spacious, well-lighted and well ventilated halls provides the campus an aura of great intellectual activity. The building in fact, is one of the biggest in the colleges of Punjab. The cycle shed near the main gate of the college provides facilities for parking of cycles, scooters, cars to the students and the staff of the college. It has been extended further this year to accommodate the increasing number of vehicles. Adequate arrangements have been made to provide cold drinking water facilities to the students by making provision for water coolers. The lawns and flower beds have been reshaped to satisfy the eye of even an expert aesthete.

Another landmark was achieved in July 1990 with the starting of science faculty in the college. With this, long-standing need of the students of this area was fulfilled. In a very short span of time, a separate block was built for this faculty. Today this block is complete, with its well-lighted and large-sized class rooms and well equipped laboratories. Having started with only senior secondary certificate part I and II classes, the college now runs classes up to B.Sc. III (Non-Medical and Medical), M.Sc., M.Com., M.A. classes.

## PROFESSIONAL COURSES





## RULES AND PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION 2019-2020

Every student seeking admission to this college shall purchase a copy of the college prospectus including the prescribed Admission Form from the college on payment of Rs. 200/- in cash.

Candidates seeking admission to this college are required to note the following instructions :

- \* To fill up the particulars in the prescribed admission form completely in his/her own hand-writing neatly.
- \* To produce the following certificate/documents along with the admission form:
  - \* Detailed marks certificate (original) of having passed the lower examination.
  - \* Character Certificate of good conduct from the head of the institution last attended.
  - \* The Board/University Registration Card of the student, if already registered with the Board/University.
  - \* Four passport size photographs to be pasted at the relevant space in the admission form.
- \* Those Candidates who have passed the lower examination from the Board/University other than Punjab School Education Board, Mohali, Panjab University, Chandigarh like Punjabi University, Patiala/ Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar would be required to produce Eligibility Certificate from the Punjab School Education Board/Panjab University, Chandigarh, as the case may be at the time of admission to this College. For this purpose they should apply beforehand to the University/Board on prescribed application form along with the required documents and the eligibility fee.
- \* Those candidates who have passed the lower examination from Punjabi University, Patiala/ Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar would be required to produce the Original Detailed Marks Card of the lower examination passed by them and also the Original Migration Certificate issued by the University from which they are migrating.

**NOTE:-** In case a Candidate is allowed to join provisionally subject to the production of Migration Certificate, Eligibility Certificate or/and original Detailed Marks Card of the lower exam passed, as the case may be, he/she will be continuing his/her studies at this College entirely at his/her own risk and responsibility.

1. Students belonging to Scheduled Caste/Backward Class will be required to attach with his/her admission form a certificate to this effect from a competent authority to avail the necessary concession.
2. Every candidate will appear personally for interview for admission.
3. The Principal reserves the right to grant or refuse admission to a student without assigning any reason.
4. Girl students are admitted in all the classes (faculties/groups).
5. Outstanding players, speakers, singers, artists, musicians and dramatists may be given due weightage for the purpose of admission to various classes.
6. The student selected for admission by the Principal will be required to deposit the college dues in full on the same day. Ordinarily, part-payment is not allowed.

**NOTE :**

- \* Such Students as are placed under compartment in the Panjab University examination and P.S.E.B. April/May 2015 may apply to appear in the compartment subject in the supplementary examination.
- \* Students who are placed under compartment in any examination of another University/Board shall not apply for admission to the next higher class even provisionally.
- \* Those students whose results are declared late by the Panjab University, Chandigarh or by the Punjab School Education Board may seek admission within 15 days of the declaration of the result, provided seats are available in the class.
- \* College dues once paid will not be refunded/re-adjusted for any reason whatsoever.

**PANJAB UNIVERSITY CHANDIGARH****INSTRUCTIONS FOR ADMISSION TO VARIOUS COURSES  
(SESSION 2019-2020)****1. GENERAL INFORMATION:-**

- (i) The candidates will be admitted strictly in accordance with the Regulations/Rules contained in latest University Calendars/guidelines/any other Instructions which have been issued/may be issued by the University, from time to time, for the respective Courses/examinations and in order of merit. The instructions given in this circular should in particular be adhered to while making admission for the Session 2019-20. The list of all such candidates selected for admission/waiting list be displayed on the Notice Board/Website of the respective College.
- (ii) The admission forms should have separate columns for Father's and Mother's names. The name of mother and father should be mentioned in all records. However, in case some students do not wish to declare the name of both the parents (either of mother or father) they may not be insisted upon and no one be denied admission on this ground.
- (iii) Where the number of the seats are fixed, the total number of students admitted to a particular class must not exceed the number of seats sanctioned by the University.
- (iv) The admission be made according to the schedule of dates approved by the University and circulated by the Deputy Registrar (Colleges) from time to time.
- (v) When an admission notice is given in the Newspapers by the respective college, it should be clearly mentioned that the candidates coming from other Universities/Boards/Councils/Bodies must bring with them, qualifying examination Certificate at the time of admission. Migration Certificate be submitted latest by 15th of October in the University Office. These certificates be verified from the Result Gazette. If Gazette is not available student should submit an affidavit to the effect that if the documents are not found correct his/her admission to the course will liable to be cancelled.
- (vi) For admission, fraction of marks less than the requisite percentage would not be rounded off to the advantage of the candidates, i.e. 32.9%, 39.9% and 49.9% shall not be rounded off to 33%, 40% and 50% etc.
- (vii) Permission of the Vice-Chancellor is mandatory for admission after the expiry of the last date. However, the candidates be admitted provisionally at their own risk and responsibility subject to approval of the late admission by the Vice-Chancellor and conveyed to concerned College/Deptt. by the University.
- (viii) A student whose result of +2 examinations in February/March conducted by a School Board is published late, but not later than 14th August, 2019 may be admitted without late fee within 15 working days of the declaration of the result and his/her attendance shall be counted from the date of admission. This would be applicable to an Open School Board also. After expiry of this period, the late admission approval from the Vice-Chancellor is required. (See Rule 10 at Page No. 355 of P.U. Calendar Vol-III, 2016).

In the case of Panjab University students who have already appeared in any of its examination and the result is declared late for one reason or the other, the admission cannot be said to be a case of fresh admission. They are already midway of the class. In these cases, admissions to the next class/course may be allowed within 10 working days, from the date of dispatch of result, without charging any late fee.

- (ix) To ensure transparency and credibility in their admission procedure, universities and institutions of higher education need to make liberal use of notice board, print media, electronic media, website etc. to declare their admission procedure.
- (x) Following admission, university and college authorities should take proactive action to communicate to newly admitted SC, ST, OBC, minorities students and students from low income families (regardless of the level of their course), the availability of tuition-waver, free-ships, loan and scholarship available to these categories.
- (xi) The College(s) Prospectus should contain all the information in respect of different scholarships, in detail, offered by the Panjab University to its affiliated Colleges. The Colleges should display total number of Scholarship Scheme(s) on their notice boards.
- (xii) To make admission process more transparent, the Colleges should be displayed fee structure, merit-list etc. on their notice board as well as upload on the college website.

## 2. GENERAL CONDITIONS REGARDING ELIGIBILITY:-

- (a) It must be ensured that the examination passed by a candidate on the basis of which he/she is seeking admission to the next higher class in the College stands recognized by the Panjab University. For this purpose, the Equivalence Booklet printed in the year 1999 be consulted along with the Consolidated Supplementary List, 2004 to 2007 already sent to all the colleges by the General Branch. However, if any College does not have the printed Equivalence Booklet, 1999, the same may be had from the Printing Store of the University on payment of prescribed cost.
- (b) Only eligible candidates be admitted to the course concerned. Responsibility for making wrong admission or allowing wrong combination of subjects to a student, shall lie entirely with the College/Department Authorities.
- (c) All Foreign Students shall obtain **Eligibility Certificate** from the Deputy Registrar(General), Panjab University in all cases and the admission of the foreign students to College / Teaching Departments would be governed by the Guidelines issued by the Dean Foreign Students. **The eligibility form should be accompanied by a forwarding letter from the Principal of the College/Chairperson of the Teaching Department indicating the reason for denying the admission to the candidate.** After obtaining the Eligibility Certificate, the candidate should submit the same to College/ Department where he/she is seeking admission.
- (d) An affidavit in duplicate from each candidate having gap year seeking admission to the College/Department to the effect that he/she was not disqualified by any Board/Body/Council/ University and he/she was not already registered with the Panjab University (wherever applicable), must be obtained by the concerned College/Department before allowing admission. In case the

candidate was disqualified, the period of disqualification and the activities in which the candidate was involved during the period of disqualification, should be indicated by the candidate in the said affidavit. A copy of the affidavit be sent to the University (R & S Branch) along with Registration Return. No candidate be admitted under any circumstances during the disqualification period. In case of readmission after a long spell, the candidate must quote his/her old Registration Number of Panjab University.

- (e) That a candidate who has been placed under compartment/re-appear in one subject only with at least 20% marks (Theory & Practical taken together) in the subject in which he/she has been placed in compartment in the +2 examination conducted by the Open School Board in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the 1st Semester of B.A./B.Sc. (General)/B.Com./B.B.A./B.C.A. course under 10+2+3 system of education. He/She should have cleared the compartment before the declaration of the first year result. If he/she could not submit the relevant papers/documents on the date of declaration of result then his/her admission will be automatically cancelled. {with effect from the academic session 2009-2010} (Amended vide Syndicate Para-16 dated 18.05.2014)
- (f) The candidate who is admitted in first/third/fifth semester will be allowed to be promoted to second/fourth/sixth semester respectively. However, for promotion from second to third or from fourth to fifth semester the candidate will have to clear 50% of the total papers till that semester. It is further clarified that for calculating 50% fraction, like, 2.5, 3.5 or 4.5 will be considered as 3, 4, or 5 respectively.
- (g) The candidate who got admission in 1st semester in a college and after completing the 1st semester could not get the admission in 2nd semester due to one or other reason, should be given admission in the 2nd semester next year with the condition that the candidate must have attended the classes / appeared in examinations in the college in 1st semester, this provision/facility be extended to the candidates of 3rd and 5th Semester as well. Such a facility be extended to Post-Graduate students also. To overcome this problem, few admission dates for 2nd semester should also be allotted in January i.e. **one week after the Winter Break as per P.U. Academic Calendar, 2019-20 (As per Syndicate Para 49 Dated 01-05-2016).**
- (h) The Vice-Chancellor has allowed to change a subject in any circumstances in the even semester examination whereas he/she will have to clear that subject as deficient in lower semester examination which he/she has changed in the higher semester for qualifying the award of Bachelor's Degree (Vide Circular No. Misc./A-6/3295 dated 06-04-2018).

### 3. RESERVATION OF SEATS:-

- (a) The reservation of seats shall be governed by the Regulation 29.1 and 29.2 given at page 168 in P.U. Cal. Volume-I, 2007 and any intimation sent by the Deputy Registrar(Colleges). However, it is clarified that the concession is not available in the case of candidates who are seeking admission to the next higher class on the basis of having earned compartment in +2 Examination i.e. in the subject of compartment.
- (b) (i) Two Additional Seats for One Girl out of the only Two Girl Children per unit per course subject to

maximum limit of four

- (ii) One Additional seat for Cancer Patients
- (iii) AIDS Patients
- (iv) Thalassemia Patients

The benefit of additional seats under the aforesaid categories will not be admissible to the students seeking admission in the courses falling under regulatory agencies such as **MCI, DCI, BCI and NCTE**.

- (c) (i) Two Additional seats for Rural Area Students over and above **(As per curcular No. Misc./ A-6/85782-85982 date 01-05-2017 and Misc./A-6/2404 dated 14-03-2018 (Already circulated by the Colleges Branch)**
- (ii) One additional seat for Border Area students over and above the sanctioned seats for UG/PG Courses offered by the Teaching Departments/Regional Centres/and Colleges affiliated to Panjab University **(As per circular No.Misc/A-6/85782-85982 dated 01.06.2017 [Already circulated by the Colleges Branch]).**
- (iii) The following concession be given for admission to various courses in Educational Institutions up to academic year 2020-21 only to those wards of martyrs/permanent disabled (up to 80% leading to incapacitation) of KARGIL WAR who have a valid certificate from the Ministry of Defence to this and the same be entered in the Pension Book of the family:-
  - (i) 1% seats with minimum of 1 seat in the Departments and affiliated Colleges except in partially financed/self-financing courses.
  - (ii) Exemption offee.
  - (iii) Exemption in hostel fee. (Vide Syndicate Para 30 (XI) dated 29.7.08.
- (d) (i) Blind students who join a regular degree/Post-graduate degree courses at the P.U. would be allowed exemption from payment of tuition fee & would be provided free accommodation in the University Hostels. {Approved vide Syndicate Para (iv) meeting held on 19-08-1996}.
- (ii) The free education to the completely blind student belonging to below poverty line, as described by the relevant Government notification/s, in any course in the University and its affiliated Colleges, Subject to the students being otherwise eligible and on merit, but the candidate has to submit an affidavit to this effect issued by the competent authority. Even the free hostel accommodation may also be considered, if required by the students, but he will have to pay the mess charges, which are already subsidized. A limited number of course books (one per paper) may also be considered which would be returnable after the completion of the course. (Syndicate Para-1 dated 18-04- 2009).
- (e) Free education to children of persons killed in November, 1984 riots and terrorist violence in Punjab State. {Approved vide Syndicate para 5 (Statement 'A') dated 25-04-1987}.

#### 4. ADMISSION TO BACHELOR OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (BCA) 1st Semester:

(a) A person who has passed +2 examination in any discipline with at least 50% marks and passed Mathematics as one of the subjects at Matriculation examination level shall be eligible to join the first semester class of B.C.A. Course.

OR

(b) Any other examination recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (a) above.

##### Provided further that:-

A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by a Board/Bodies/Councils/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of BCA courses, provided he/she fulfills the following conditions:-

- (a) He/She should have been placed compartment in one subject only;
- (b) He/She should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subjects in which he/she had been placed in compartment and;
- (c) He/She should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of the examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.

The admission of the candidate with a compartment as indicated above shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after he/she cleared the compartment in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission. In case the candidate does not clear the chances subsequent to his/her admission. In case the candidate does not clear the compartment at any of the two consecutive chances allowed to him/her subsequent to the date of his/her admission, his/her provisional admission to the course shall stand cancelled.

**Explanation:-** In case of a compartment candidate, eligibility shall be determined by including the marks of the subjects in which the candidate has been placed under compartment.

(iii) Subjects to the reservation made by the University, the admission shall be on merit.

**NOTE:-**

- (i) 10% weight-age be given for each subject of (Mathematics/Statistics) and (Computer Science/Computer Applications/Information Technology or equivalent) to the candidate who studied at 10+2 level at the time of admission in B.C.A. 1st Semester from the admissions of 2015.
- (ii) That 20% weight-age in total to those students who studied (Mathematics/Statistics) and (Computer Science or Computer Applications or Information Technology or Information System) at +2 level be given.

#### 5. ADMISSION TO B.A./B.Sc. - 1st Semester:-

(I) A person who has passed one of the following examinations with pass in English as one of the subjects shall be eligible to join the First Semester class of B.A. or B.Sc (General/B.Sc. (Bio-Info.) and (Honours) degree course in a College affiliated to this University, however, a person who has not qualified English as one of the subjects at the +2 examination, shall be eligible to join B.A./B.Sc.-1st Semester provisionally subjects at his/her qualifying the deficient subject of English from the parent

Board/Board/Council/University in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission, failing which his/her admission to B.A./B.Sc. 1st Semester and the result for the examination shall automatically stand cancelled:-

- (a) B.A./B.Sc./B.Com Part-I (Old Scheme)/Intermediate/Arts/Science/Agriculture examination of Panjab University;
- (b) The +2 examination under 10+2+3 system of education of a recognized University/ Board/ Council;
- (c) PrakShastri/Vishard examination with compulsory English. (Vide SenatePara-LXXVII dated 06.12.2009);
- (d) Any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent to (a),(b) and(c)above.

**Provided that:-**

- (a) A person joining the B.Sc. course must have obtained at least 40 percent marks in the aggregate of the qualifying examination;
- (b) A B.Sc. student must have out of the three elective subjects offered by him/her (**excepting Anthropology**) passed at least 2 Science subjects in the qualifying examination. He/She may offer the third elective subject from the Faculty of Science or Faculty of Arts.

Provided further that a student shall be eligible to opt the subject of:-

- (a) Computer Science at the B.A/B.Sc. level if he/she passed the +2 examination with Science/ Commerce/ Economics/Mathematics and Computer Science/Information Technology etc. as one of the elective subjects or optional subjects.
- (b) Biochemistry if he/she passed the +2 examination with the following subjects:-
  - 1. Physics      2. Chemistry      3. Mathematics/Biology
- (c) A student may opt for Computer Science in B.Sc. (General) (Non-Medical) as one of the elective subjects with the following combination (amended vide Syndicate Paragraph 32, dated 11.7.2005):-
  - 1. Mathematics      2. Physics      3. Computer Science

**Note:** The candidate who have passed computer related subject like Computer science/Information Technology, etc. as one of the Elective subjects or optional subject at +2 level, be allowed to opt the subject of Computer Science at B.A./B.Sc. level w.e.f. the academic session 2012-13 (Syndicate Para 18 dated 27.09.2011).

- (i) A candidate who has been placed under compartment at +2 examination conducted by a Board/Body/Council/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of B.A./B.Sc./B.Sc. (Bio. Info.) course(s) he/she fulfills the following conditions:-
  - (a) He/she should have been placed in compartment in one subject only;
  - (b) He/she should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he had been placed in compartment and;
  - (c) He/she should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of examination as laid down in the relevant regulations;

**Provided that;**

- (a) A candidate joining the B.A. First Semester should have obtained at least 33% marks in the aggregate of all the subjects (including the marks obtained by him in the subject of compartment, Theory & Practical/s taken together) taken up by him at the +2 examination.
- (b) A candidate joining the B.Sc. First Semester should have obtained at least 40% marks in the aggregate of all the subjects (including the marks obtained by him/her in the subject of compartment, Theory & Practical/s taken together) taken up by him/her at the +2 examination.

**NOTE:**

The candidates securing less than 20% marks in the subject of compartment at the +2 examination be made eligible to join B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Part-I courses, if they cleared or secure 20% or more marks in the subject in the Supplementary Examination held in July/August, on or before the last date for admission with late fee with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor, provided the seat/s is/are available (Syndicate Para 43 (xiv) meeting held on 27.01.2013).

## 6. ADMISSION TO BACHELOR OF COMMERCE (B.Com.)-1 st Semester:-

3.1 (A) Admission to the first semester of B.Com. Degree course shall be open to a person who has passed one of the following examinations conducted by a recognized Board/Council/University:-

- (a) +2 examination or B.Com.- Part-I (Old scheme) of Panjab University with three of the following subjects securing at least 45 per cent marks in the aggregate:-
  - Commerce (or theory of commerce or foundation course in commerce)
  - Accountancy (or book keeping and accountancy)
  - Economics
  - Business Organization (or Business Management or Theory and Practice of Management)
  - Insurance (or General Insurance or Life Insurance)
  - Banking and Trade
  - Commercial Geography
  - Office Management and Secretarial Practice (or Office Organization and Management)
  - Mercantile Law (or any Company Law)
  - Auditing
  - Typewriting and Stenography/Computers (for typewriting)
- (b) +2 Examination or B.A. Part-I (Old Scheme) of Panjab University with at least two of the subjects mentioned in (a) securing at least 50% marks in aggregate;
- (c) +2 Examination or B.A. Part-I/B.Sc.-I/Pre-Engineering/Pre-Medical Examination of the Panjab University under the Old Scheme not covered in (b) securing at least 50% marks.
- (d) Any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent to (a) or (b) or (c) as given above with requisite percentage of marks given under each clause.

Provided that a candidate seeking admission to the first semester of B.Com. should have passed in the subject of English at the +2 examination and in cases where passing in English is not necessary

according to the regulations of certain Boards/Bodies/Councils/Universities in India, the admission of the candidate shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after he has cleared the subject of English as a deficient subject from the parent Board/Body/Council/University in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission. In case a candidate does not clear the relevant subject at any of the two consecutive chances allowed to him/her subsequent to the date of his/her admission, his/her provisional admission to the course shall stand cancelled.

***Provided further that:***

A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by a Board/Bodies/Councils/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of B.Com course, provided he/she fulfills the following conditions:

- (i) He/she should have been placed compartment in one subject only;
- (ii) He/she should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he/she had been placed in compartment; and
- (iii) He/she should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of the examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.

The admission of the candidate with a compartment as indicated above shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after he has cleared the compartment in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission. In case the candidate does not clear the compartment at any of the two consecutive chances allowed to him/her subsequent to the date of his/her admission, his/her provisional admission to the course shall stand cancelled.

(B) Subject to the reservation made by the University, the admission shall be on merit. The merit for this purpose shall be determined on the basis of the score of a candidate to be computed as follows:

- (i) Percentage of marks in the qualifying examination;
- (ii) Add score of 4 for each of the subjects passed from the subjects referred in (3.1) not exceeding 16 in total.

***Explanation:*** - In cases of a compartment candidate, eligibility shall be determined by including the marks of the subject in which the candidate has been placed under compartment.

**NOTE:-**

The candidates securing less than 20% marks in the subject of compartment at the +2 examination be made eligible to join B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Part-I courses, if they cleared or secure 20% or more marks in the subject in the Supplementary Examination held in July/August, on or before the last date for admission with late fee with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor, provided the seat/s is/are available (Syndicate para 43 (xiv) meeting held on 27-01-2013).

### 7. ADMISSION TO POST-GRADUATE COURSES:-

(i) (a) The admission will be made strictly in order of merit.  
(b) For admission to M.A./M.Sc./M.Com.-Ist semester in case the College/Departments decide to hold Entrance Tests at their own level, the following procedure will be followed besides the rules/Regulations of Panjab University governing eligibility, in a particular subject.

**(c) ACADEMIC WEIGHTAGE:- 60%**

(a) 10th class:	10%
(b) 10+2 class:	10%
(c) B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.:	40%

**(d) WRITTEN AND ORAL/APTITUDE TEST:- 40%**

(e) 15% weightage will be given for Honours subject for pursuing M.A./M.Sc./M.Com. Courses in the related subject.  
(f) 5% weightage for graduate student of Panjab University.

Merit list of students to be admitted in a college be displayed on College notice board and upload on website.

**(ii) Admission to P.G.D.C.A. (Semester System):-**

(a) Bachelor's degree of Panjab University under 10+2+3 system of examination with atleast 50% marking any discipline.

OR

(b) B.E. / B.Tech.

OR

(c) Any other examination recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (a) or (b) above.

### 8. MIGRATION/DEFICIENT SUBJECT(S) :-

A candidate who has passed his/her 1st Semester and 2nd Semester of B.A. /B.Sc. (General)/B.Com./B.B.A./B.C.A. Course conducted by another University/College affiliated to another university in India under specific authorization by the University concerned, be allowed to migrate to a college affiliated to this University/Department of Evening Studies/University School of Open Learning in the 3rd semester/5th semester of the respective course (as per rules prescribed under Chapter XIV-'Migration of Students' Page 289 to 304 of P.U. Calendar Volume-III, 2016) on the condition that such a candidate will have to clear the deficient subject/s if any, within the permissible chances.

Deficiencies should be determined by the Principal/Chairperson at the time of admission under intimation to University (i.e. on the Registration Return and examination forms) as well as to the students as per University rule No.6 given at page 302 of PU. Cal. Vol-III, 2016.

## 9. INFORMATION REGARDING COMPARTMENT CANDIDATES OF OTHER UNIVERSITIES:-

(a) A student of any other University who is placed in compartment in 1st & 2nd Semester/3rd & 4th Semester of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./BCA/BBA Course be not allowed to join the 5th & 6th Semester Course of this University.

(b) Compartment Candidates of +2 Examination seeking admission to first degree level running parallel utility oriented certificate/ Diploma/Advances Diploma and add-on Courses Programme along with B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./BCA/BBA Part-I Course:

With a view to vocationalize the education at first-degree level during Xth plan period, parallel utility-oriented certificate/Diploma/Advanced Diploma Programs have been introduced. The candidates who are placed in compartment in +2 examination having been admitted provisionally to B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Part-I Class shall also be considered to have been admitted provisionally in these courses. The eligibility requirements and Regulations/Rules for certificate/Diploma/ Advanced Diploma Courses sanctioned by the U.G.C. under Career Orientation Programme to various affiliated Colleges from the admissions of 2004 as Add-On Courses for B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(Semester System)(1st, 2nd and 3rd) will be same as for admission to B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Course (Semester System).

## ADMISSION OF GIRL STUDENTS

Girl students are admitted to Arts, Science, Commerce, BCA and M.A. classes. All the facilities have been provided for them in a separate girls common room with a lady attendant. The lady-Dean Girl Students welfare imparts them training in conduct, good manners, decency by giving lectures from time to time. Every arrangement has been made for the security of the girl students.

## RULES FOR PAYMENT OF COLLEGE DUES

1. Every student will have to make full payment of dues at the time of admission. No part payment of dues is allowed.
2. Cheques and bank drafts will not be accepted.
3. Fee once paid shall not be refunded.
4. Tuition fee from May to Oct. 2019 & other monthly charges of University/Board/College will be payable at the time of admission.
5. Dates for payment of college dues (quarterly) are fixed and announced by the office from time to time.
6. Students, unable to pay their dues on the due date may apply to the Principal for extension of the date of payment. Such applications should reach the Principal three days before the due date.
7. A fine of Re.1/- per day will be charged for the late payment of dues.
8. Names of the defaulters on account of non payment of dues will be struck off. A student whose name is struck off may be re-admitted with the permission of the Principal on payment of Rs. 150/- as readmission fee and the late fee fine of Re. 1/- per day counted from the due date upto the last date of the month in which the fee is paid.
9. The students absent or on leave from college must arrange to pay their dues on the due dates.
10. Fresh admission fee of Rs. 150/- and University Registration fee of 40/- will be charged if is not reimbursed by the Panjab Government.

**Note:**

- (1) Annual/monthly charges may be revised by the University/Board/College.
- (2) No tuition fee will be charged from the eligible Scheduled caste/Backward class students who are residents of Punjab only. However, Science fee will be charged if it is not reimbursed by the Panjab Government.

#### LEAVE RULES:

Reason and the date of leave must be stated clearly on the prescribed form.

Leave for more than two days will be granted by the Principal on the recommendation of tutor concerned.


Leave upto two days will be sanctioned by the Chief Tutor concerned on recommendation of the tutor.

10. Absence from the college without permission will not be entertained as an excuse for non-payment of college dues in time.







## RULES FOR THE ISSUE OF BOOKS

- i) The books may be retained by the students for a period of 14 days after which they must be returned or got re-issued, the latter depending upon the discretion of the Librarian.
- ii) A fine of one rupee per day, per volume is charged if the book is not returned by the due date.
- iii) Reference books, text-books and rare-books, are not issued to the students and can only be read or consulted in the library.
- iv) If a student loses, defaces or damages a book, he/she shall be liable to pay the cost of it or replace the book along with the late return fine, if any.
- v) Current issues of the periodicals and newspapers are not issued.
- vi) If a student disturbs the peaceful atmosphere of the library by making a noise, the librarian has the discretion to ask the student to leave the library building.
- vii) The library will be closed once a year for the purpose of stock checking. All the books borrowed from the library must be returned as notified by the Librarian/Principal.
- viii) The librarian reserves the right of recalling a book whenever he thinks it necessary.
- ix) Library card must be produced at the time of getting the roll number and the refund of library securities.

## BOOK BANK SECTION

The College Library has facility of book bank for meritorious and the needy students. Books are issued from the Book Bank to the deserving students for the full session.

## ID-CUM-LIBRARY CARD

From the Academic Session 2015-16, the College has the provision of PVC ID-cum-Library Card to the student with barcode facility for their record in computer.

All the students admitted to the college are issued identity-cum-Library Card at the time of their admission. The purpose of this is to inculcate in the students the habit of maintaining their diary as also to provide them with all information about the College. The Student's diary also contains the photograph of the students and serves as an Identity Card. The card includes the library, college rules and blank pages for the issue of library books. In view of the above facts, full care of safety of the identity-cum-library card should be taken. If it is lost, a duplicate card is issued at the discretion of the college librarian/Principal after establishing a complete identification and genuineness of the student. It should be handed over to anybody else lest it should be misused. The owner is responsible for all the consequences occurring therefrom. All the students of the College are directed to collect their identity-cum-Library cards after submission of their library membership forms along with passport size photograph.

Every student is required to keep identity-cum-library card with him/her while in the college. If a student is found without it on any occasion, he/she will be fined by the Principal.

## ATTENTION TO AVERAGE STUDENTS

Being situated in a small town, the college is fed by students hailing from rural areas. As such the college gets students with average standard of awareness and intelligence. But special attention is paid to raise the level of these students so as to enable them to compete with the students of big cities.

### CARE FOR BRILLIANT STUDENTS

The brilliant students joining the college also get special and extra attention. The enlightened and highly qualified staff of the college takes extra pain to run special coaching classes for such students. Further such students can always have an easy access to their teachers and discuss their problems freely with them. Tutorial groups are formed for commerce classes and in their tutorial periods such brilliant students get the personal attention of the teachers and can get the same facility in composition groups where the number of students is very small and so they can discuss their problems with their teachers in a more congenial and free atmosphere.

The college provides a wide range of concessions to the students distinguishing themselves either in academic sphere or in the field of sports or extra moral activities. The poor and deserving students also do not go unaided and are granted fee concessions. Some deserving students are given stipends and scholarships from the student aid fund.

The college does not provide merely academic knowledge to the students but it also aims at character building. The real objective of education is over-all development of personality, cultural and moral upliftment and grooming human beings to make them cultured and enlightened. Thus special emphasis is laid on character-building activities. The students are made to imbibe the qualities of discipline, dedication to duty and patriotism.

### CURBING RAGGING IN INSTITUTIONS

It has been impressed upon by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India that relating to admission of the students in any educational institution if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if his/her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority can expel him/her from the institution.

### ADDITIONAL SEAT FOR GIRL CHILD AND CANCER / AIDS / THALASSEMIA PATIENT

#### FOR GIRL CHILD

1. There is provision for an additional seat for the single girl child for admission to a given course in the Panjab University provided she is otherwise eligible from all angles. THE RESERVATION IN FAVOUR OF THE GIRL CHILD WHETHER A SINGLE GIRL OR ONE AMONGST TWO OR EVEN WITH NO MALE CHILD MAY BE EXTENDED TO ONE OF THE GIRLS OF A COUPLE.
2. A copy of an affidavit on a stamp paper worth 20/- duly attested by 1st class Magistrate, to be obtained from the Parents of the girl child.

For Cancer and Aids Patient:

The students will submit a certificate with proof from the National Medical Institute like PGI, AIIMS.

### ADMISSION AGAINST NRI SEATS

'That all the admission against NRI seats in the Panjab University must be strictly limited to genuine 'NRI and/or their sons and daughters'.

## WOMEN GRIEVANCES CELL

The women Grievances Redressal cell of our college works under the able guidance of a lady lecturer every year. In this field, stress is laid upon the need to provide an equal status to both girls and boys. Every person in our college is honoured according to his/her status. There is no favouritism, no politics. To avoid violation, perversion, molestation and abuse thorough check is made by the authorities.

## CAREER GUIDANCE CELL

The main objective of the career guidance cell is to make the students aware of the leading courses and career opportunities available in today's world. It also helps the students to select a career according to their aptitude and capability. This cell also counsels the students to overcome their difficulties and accept the realities of life.

## NATIONAL CADET CORPS (N.C.C)

The facilities for N.C.C. training exist in the college. The purpose of this scheme is to inculcate a sense of discipline among the youth and to prepare a second line of defence in case of National Emergency. The college provides opportunities of training under the National Cadet Corps. Enrolment for N.C.C. (Boys and Girls) has to be done at the time of admission.

## SPORTS AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Physical development is no less important than intellectual development. Games and Sports, besides giving physical health, also refresh the mind and thus help in intellectual growth as well. Keeping this in view, the college has given due place and importance to this department. The college has spacious playgrounds for Hockey, Football, Volleyball, Basketball and Badminton. Games are conducted under the supervision of lecturers in Health and Physical Education and other members of the staff. College colors, prizes and certificates are awarded to those distinguishing in the games.

Athletic meets are also organized. Physical Education is taught as a subject upto degree classes.

## NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (N.S.S.)

The college has two units of N.S.S.-one for the girls and the other for the boys. Each unit has a strength of 100 students. Enrolment is done in the beginning of the session. Interested students can contact the programme officer and get themselves enrolled after fulfilling the formalities. The organization aims at creating a spirit of service and dedication to the nation among students. It also aims at involving them in programmes of national reconstruction like eradication of poverty, rural development, adult education programmes,etc. Apart from undertaking other programmes, it also organizes one 10 day camp every year.

## DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

Under the able and expert guidance of different teachers, who act as incharges of items like Bhangra, Giddha, Drama, Music etc, students are prepared every year to be sent for participation in youth festival at zonal as well as inter-zonal levels and to various colleges holding inter-college competitions. Cultural functions are also organized at the college level to enable the students to display their talents. These functions help in channelizing energies of the students in the right direction and in making a fruitful use of their leisure, besides helping them in personality development.

### YOUTH CLUB

With a view to fruitfully channelising the energies of the youth, there is a provision at the University level for organizing youth clubs in colleges. Our college, too has its wing. It enrols one hundred students as members. Other students can also take part in its activities. Office bearers are elected from amongst the members, who work under a teacher-in-charge. This helps in creating leadership qualities among youth.

### TOURS/TRIPS

Educational tours get the highest importance among youth. The college has provision to organize educational tours each year during winter/autumn vacations.

### ENVIRONMENT EDUCATION

'The compulsory subject of Environment education would be offered by the student in the first year of undergraduate classes in all streams (Arts, Commerce, Science) from the session 2014-15 onwards.

The college also has a number of subject societies and associations/clubs. The objective again is multifaceted development of personality and gainful channelization of exuberant youthful energy. Another objective is the involvement of maximum number of students in cultural activities and to develop in them competence of public speaking, the power of organization and sense of civic responsibility. ### COLLEGE MAGAZINE

The college brings out an annual magazine 'Anant Deepti'. It has seven sections English, Hindi, Punjabi, Science, Commerce, Planning Forum and News Section. It gives coverage to various activities of the college during the academic session through a coloured photograph section. It provides the students an opportunity to write something creative and original. It is edited by an Editorial Board consisting of editors from the Staff and Students.

### COLLEGE DISPENSARY

The college also provides Medical aid to the students during their stay in the campus. A part-time doctor attends to the students daily for one hour. A regular supply of medicines is made available for the needy students. Serious cases are immediately referred to the Civil Hospital, Mukerian for the required treatment.

## CHANGE OF SUBJECTS

1. A candidate may change the subjects within the same group.
2. A candidate may change the group from Science/ Agriculture / Technical / Commerce/ all groups in vocational stream to Humanities group after passing the XII class examination.
3. After admission, change of subject/group shall be allowed by the Principal up to a date to be fixed by the Chairman of the Board. Application for such a change of subjects will be made on payment of Rs.50/- on the prescribed form available from the college office. Such application forms should also be signed by the Father/ Guardian of the student.
4. Students may consult the concerned teachers before and after the change of subject.

## RULES FOR CYCLE/SCOOTER/CAR PARKING

1. All Cycles/Scooters/Cars must be locked and placed in the cycle stand as cycles/scooters lying outside the stand are liable to be lifted. The college authorities shall not be responsible for the loss of any vehicle if parked unlocked.
2. All such students who come to the college on cycles/scooters must meet the clerk and get their cycles/scooters registered with the cycle shed peon. All such cycles/scooters must be got numbered.
3. The college undertakes no responsibility in the matter of un-registered cycles/scooters. Infact, unregistered cycles/scooters are not permitted to be parked anywhere in the college.
4. The cycle shed peon will be responsible for the loss of registered cycles/scooters provided :
  - (i) The student has not been guilty of breach of rules and satisfies the Principal in this respect.
  - (ii) The student has got the token corresponding to his/her cycle/scooter.
5. A fine of Rs. 50/- shall be charged for the loss of cycle/scooter token.
6. Students trying to mis-inform and take undue advantage to cycle shed open in any way, doing harm to the cycle/scooter in the cycle/scooter shed and those guilty of misbehaviour shall be fined as per the offence.
7. Students are advised to not to place their cycles/scooters in front of railway gate of the college. A heavy fine will be imposed on the student who places his scooter/cycle/motorcycle in front of railway gate of the college.
