





Swamiji travelled all over the world to share his experience and to uplift and awaken humanity.

LATE SH. B. N. MAKKAR, the founder Life President of S.P. N. College Mukerian, left for his heavenly abode on 12-4-1998. He started the project of opening this college, with the active co-operation of the people of this area and finally succeeded in founding it in 1971. Founder president Late Sh. B.N.Makkar always identified himself with the youthful aspirations among the college managing committee, staff and the students. He was born on 18th October, 1924 at Mukerian, Distt. Hoshiarpur. He was a person of versatile qualities. He spent the better part of his life in the service of mankind. He was a bold speaker and organizer. It made him lovable to one and all. He was a leading public man and eminent educationist of the area. The coming generations shall remember him for years to come. During the span of these 45 years, the college has grown into a splendid temple of higher education and is now counted among the leading institutions of the state. Its achivements in academic, cultural and sports sphere have been consistently outstanding for these years. Started with Arts and Commerce faculties, the college has now science faculty also. The credit for all this goes to our beloved president Sh. B.N.Makkar, who left us all in tears.

During 45 years, managing committee, principals and the staff of S.P.N. College contributed a lot to the expansion and progress of the institution. In the beginning, the college had five class rooms and the student strength was less than four hundered. But the college continued making a tremendous progress every year. The present number of 50 class rooms, administration block, a big separate library building, a big student centre, a computer centre, parent-cum-visitor room, management confrence room and fully equipped laboratories have given the college a new shape now. As a result of the combined efforts, the number of students in the college has swelled to about 2000. It is a rare achievement of our rare institution.



The college campus has come to wear a new and better look with the recent additions and alterations made to its premises. The library building with its two huge, spacious, well-lighted and well ventilated halls provides the campus an aura of great intellectual activity. The building in fact, is one the biggest in the colleges of Punjab. The cycle shed near the main gate of the college provides facilities for parking of cycles, scooters, cars to the students and the staff of the college. It has been extended further this year to accommodate the increasing number of vehicles. Adequate arrangements have been made to provide cold drinking water facilities to the students by making provision for a water





  - Four Passport size photographs to be pasted at the relevant space in the admission form.
- Those Candidates who have passed the lower examination from the Board/university other than Punjab School Education Board, Mohali, Panjab University, Chandigarh like Punjabi University, Patiala/ Guru Nanak Dev 坎 University, Amritsar would be required to produce Eligibility Certificate from the Punjab School Education Board/ Panjab University, Chandigarh, as the case may be, at the time of admission to this College. For this purpose they should apply beforehand to the University/ Board on prescribed application form along with the required documents and the eligibility fee.
- Those Candidates who have passed the lower examination from Punjabi University, Patiala/ Guru Nanak Dev \* University, Amritsar would be required to produce the Original Detailed Marks Card of the lower examination passed by them and also the Original migration certificate issued by the University from which they are migrating.

NOTE: In Case a Candidate is allowed to join provisionally subject to the production of Migration certificate, Eligibility Certificate or/ and original Detailed Marks Card of the lower exam passed, as the case may be, he/she will be continuing his/her studies at this College entirely at his/her own risk and responsibility.

- Students belonging to Scheduled Caste/Backward Class will be required to attach with his/her admission form a 1. certificate to this effect from a competent authority to avail the necessary concession.
- Every candidate will appear personally for interview for admission. 2.
- The Principal reserves the right to grant or refuse admission to a student without assigning any reason. 3.
- Girl students are admitted in all the classes (faculties/groups). 4.
- Outstanding players, speakers, singers, artists, musicians and dramatists may be given due weightage for the 5. purpose of admission to various classes.
- The student selected for admission by the Principal will be required to deposit the college dues in full on the 6. same day. Oridinarily, part-payment is not allowed.

#### NOTE:

- Such Students as are placed under compartment in the Panjab University examination and P. S. E. B. April/May 2015 may apply to appear in the compartment subject in the supplementary examination.
- Students who are placed under compartment in any examination of another University/ Board shall not apply for admission to the next higher class even provisionally.
- Those students whose results are declared late by the Panjab University, Chandigarh or by the Punjab School Education Board may seek admission within 15 days of the declaration of the result, provided seats are available in the class.
- College dues once paid will not be refunded/re-adjusted for any reason whatsoever.

# INSTRUCTIONS FOR ADMISSION TO VARIOUS COURSES (SESSION 2018-2019)

### 1. GENERAL INFORMATION

- i. The candidates will be admitted strictly in accordance with the Regulations/Rules contained in latest University Calendars/guidelines/any other Instructions which have been issued/may be issued by the University, from time to time for the respective courses/exams. and in order of merit. The instructions given in this circular should in particular be adhered to while making admission for the session 2018-2019. The list of all such candidates selected for admission/waiting list be displayed on the Notice Board of the respective college.
- ii. The admission forms should have separate columns for Father's and Mother's names. The name of mother and father should be mentioned in all records. However, in case some students do not wish to declare the name of both the parents (either of mother or father) they may not be insisted upon and no one be denied admission on this ground.
- iii. Where the number of the seats are fixed, the total number of students admitted to a particular class must not exceed the number of seats sanctioned by the University.
- iv. The admission be made according to the schedule of dates approved by the University and circulated by the Deputy Registrar (Colleges) from time to time.
- v. When an admission notice is given in the newspapers by the respective college, it should be clearly mentioned that the candidates coming from other Universities/Boards/Councils/Bodies must bring with them, qualifying examination Certificate at the time of admission. Migration Certificate should be submitted latest by 30th of September in the University Office. These certificates should be verified from the Result Gazette. If Gazette is not available student should submit an affidavit to the effect that if the documents are not found correct his/her admission to the course will liable to be cancelled.
- vi. For admission, fraction of marks less than the requisite percentage would not be rounded off to the advantage of the candidates, i.e. 32.9%. 39.9% and 49.9% shall not be rounded off to 33 %, 40% and 50% etc.
- vii. Permission of the Vice-chancellor is necessary for admission after the expiry of the last date. However, the candidates would be admitted provisionally at their own risk and responsibility subject to approval of the Late admission by the Vice-Chancellor and conveyed to College/Deptt. by the University.
- viii. A student whose result of +2 examinations in February/March conducted by a school Board is published late, but not later than 10th August, 2017 may be admitted without late fee within 15 working days of the declaration of the result and his/her attendance shall be counted from the date of admission. This would be applicable to an Open School Board also. After expiry of this period the late admission approval from the Vice-Chancellor is required. (See Rule 10 at Page No.312 of P.U. Calendar Vol-III, 2009).
  - In the case of Panjab University students who have already appeared in any of its examination and the result is declared late for one reason or the other the admission cannot be said to be a case of fresh admission. They are already midway of the class. In these cases admissions to the next class/course may be allowed within 10 working days, from the date of despatch of result, without charging any late fee.

- ix. To ensure transparency and credibility in their admission procedure, universities and institutions of higher education need to make liberal use of notice board, print media, electronic media, website etc. to declare their admission procedure.
- x. Following admission, university and college authorities should take proactive action to communicate to newly admitted SC, ST, OBC, minorities students and students from low income families (regardless of the level of their course), the availability of tuition-waiver, free-ships, loan and scholarship available to these categories.
- xi. The College(s) Prospectus should contain all the information in respect of different scholarships, in detail, offered by the Panjab University to its affiliated Colleges.
- xii. To make admission process more transparent, the Colleges should be displayed fee structure, meritlist etc. on their notice board.

### 2. GENERAL CONDITIONS REGARDING ELIGIBILITY:-

- (a) It must be ensured that the examination passed by a candidate on the basis of which he/she is seeking admission to the next higher class in the College stands recognized by the Panjab University. For this purpose, the Equivalence Booklet printed in the year 1999 be consulted along with the consolidated supplementary List 2004 to 2007 already sent to all the colleges by the General Branch. However, if any college does not have the printed Equivalents Booklet, 1999, the same may be had from the printing store of the university on payment of prescribed cost.
- (b) Only eligible candidates should be admitted to the course concerned. Responsibility for making wrong admission or allowing wrong combination of subjects to a student, shall lie entirely with the College/Department Authorities.
- c) All Foreign Students shall obtain Eligibility Certificate from Deputy Registrar (General) Panjab University in all cases and the admission of the foreign students to College/Teaching Departments would be governed by the Guidelines issued by the Dean Foreign Students. The eligibility form should be accompanied by a forwarding letter from the Principal of the College/Chairperson of the Teaching Department indicating the reason for denying the admission to the candidate. After obtaining the Eligibility Certificate, the candidate should submit the same to College/ Department where he/she is seeking admission.
- d) An affidavit in duplicate from each candidate having gap year seeking admission to the college/department to the effect that he/she was not disqualified by any Board/Body/Council/University and he/she was not already registered with the Panjab University (wherever applicable), must be obtained by the concerned College/Department before allowing admission. In case the candidate was disqualified the period of disqualification and the activities in which the candidate was involved during the period of disqualification should be indicated by the candidate in the said affidavit. A copy of the affidavit be sent to the university along with Registration Return. No candidate be admitted under any circumstances during the disqualification period. In case of re-admission after a long spell, the candidate must quote his/her old Registration Number of Panjab University.
- e) That a candidate who has been placed under compartment/re-appear in one subject only with at least 20% marks (Theory & Practical taken together) in the subject in which he/she has been placed in compartment in the +2 examination conducted by the Open School Board in India shall be eligible to

seek admission to the 1st Semester of B.A/B.Sc. (General) B.Com./B.B.A/B.C.A. course under 10+2+3 system of education. He/She should have cleared the compartment before the declaration of the first year result. If he/she could not submit the relevant papers/documents on the date of declaration of result then his/her admission will be automatically cancelled. (with effect from the academic session 2009-2010. (Vide Syndicate Para-16 dated 18.05.2014)

- (f) That a candidate who is admitted in first/third/fifth semester will be allowed to be promoted to second/fourth/sixth semester respectively. However, for promotion from second to third or from fourth to fifth semester the candidate will have to clear 50% of the total paper till that semester. It is further clarified that for calculating 50% fraction, like, 2.5, 3.5 or 4.5 will be considered as 3, 4 or 5 respectively.
- The candidate who got admission in 1st semester in a college and after completing the 1st semester could not get the admission in 2nd semester due to one or other reason, should be given admission in the 2nd semester next year with the condition that the candidate must have attended the classes/appeared in examinations in the college in 1st semester. To overcome this problem, few admission dates for 2nd semester should also be allotted in January i.e. one week after the Winter Break as per P.U. Academic Calendar, 2018-19 (As per Syndicate Para 49 Dated 01-05-2016)

#### 3. RESERVATION OF SEATS:-

(a) The reservation of seats shall be governed by the Regulation 29.1 and 29.2 given at page 168 in P.U. Cal. Volume-1, 2007 and any intimation sent by the Deputy Registrar (Colleges).

However, It is clarified that the concession is not available in the case of candidates who are seeking admission to the next higher class on the basis of having earned compartment in +2 Examination i.e.in the subject of compartment.

- (b) (i) Two Additional Seats for One Girl out of the only Two Girl Children per unit per course subject to maximum limit of four.
  - (ii) One Additional seat for Cancer Patients
  - (iii) AIDS Patients
  - (iv) Thalassemia Patients

The above concession by way of additional seats is not applicable to the students falling under regulatory agencies such as MCI, DCI, BCI and NCTE.

#### As per circular letter No. Misc./A-6/77174-77374 dated 30.03.2016(copy attached).

- (c) (i) Two Additional seats for Rural Area Students.
  - (ii) One additional seat for Border Area students over and above the sanctioned seats for UG/PG Courses offered by the Teaching Departments/Regional Centres / and Colleges affiliated to Panjab University vide circular No. Misc/ A-6/77824-78124 dated 20.04.2016 (copy attached).
  - (ii) Institutions up to academic year 2020-21 only to those wards of martyrs/permanent disabled (up to 80%-leading to in capacitation) of KARGIL WAR who have a valid certificate from the Ministry of Defence to this and the same be entered in the Pension Book of the family:-
    - 1% seats with minimum of 1 seat in the Departments and affiliated Colleges except in partially financed/self-financing courses.

- Exemption in hostel fee. (Vide Syndicate Para 30 (XI) dated 29.7.08
- Blind students who join a regular degree/Post-graduate degree courses at the P.U. would be allowed exemption from payment of tuition fee & would be provided free accommodation in the University Hostels. (Approved vide Syndicate Para (iv) meeting held on 19-08-1996). (i) V.
  - The free education to the completely blind student belonging to below poverty line, as described by the relevant Government notification/s, in any course in the University and its affiliated Colleges, Subject to the students being otherwise eligible and on merit, but the candidate has to (ii) submit an affidavit to this effect issued by the competent authority. Even the free hostel accommodation may also be considered, if required by the students, but he will have to pay the mess charges, which are already subsidized. A limited number of course books (one per paper) may also be considered which would be returnable after the completion of the course. (Syndicate Para-1dated 18-04-2009).
- VI. Free education to children of persons killed in November, 1984 riots and terrorist violence in Punjab State (Approved vide Syndicate Para5 (Statement A) dated 25-04-1987).

### ADMISSIONTO BACHELOR OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (BCA) 1st SEMESTER: 4.

(a) A person who has passed +2 examination in any discipline with at least 50% marks and passed Mathematics as one of the subject at Matriculation examination level shall be eligible to join the first semester class of B.C.A. Course.

OR

- (b) Any other examination recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (a) above.
- NOTE: (i) 10% weight-age be given for each subject of (Mathematics/Statistics) and (Computer Science/Computer Applications/Information Technology or equivalent) to the candidate who studied at 10+2 level at the time of admission in B.C.A. Ist Semester from the admissions of 2015.
  - (ii) That 20% weight-age in total to those students who studied (Mathematics/Statistics) and (Computer Science or Computer Applications or information Technology or information System) at +2 level be given.

#### ADMISSIONTO B.A./B.SC./B.COM./B.C.A./B.B.A. COURSE-1st SEMESTER:-5.

- 4.2 A candidate who has been placed under compartment at +2 examination conducted by a Board/Body/Council/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./BCA course/s if he fulfills the following conditions:-
- (i) He should have been placed in compartment in one subject only;
- (ii) He should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he had been placed in compartment and;
- (iii) He should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of examination as laid down in the relevant regulations;

#### Provided that;

(i) A candidate joining the B.A. First Semester should have obtained at least 33% marks in the aggregate of all the subject (including the marks obtained by him in the subject of compartment. Theory &

Practical/s taken together) taken up by him at the +2 examination.

(ii) A candidate joining the B. Sc. First Semester should have obtained at least 40% marks in the aggregate of all the subjects (including the marks obtained by him in the Subject of Compartment, Theory & Practicals/s taken together) taken up by him at the +2 examination.

### 6. ADMISSIONTO BACHELOR OF COMMERCE (B.COM.) - 1st Semester:-

- 3.1 (A) Admission to the first Semester of B.Com. degree course shall be open to a person who has passed one of the following examinations conducted by a recognized Board/Council/University:
  - (a) +2 examination or B.Com. -Part-I (Old scheme) of Panjab University with three of the following subjects securing at least 45 percent marks in the aggregate:-

Commerce (or theory of commerce or foundation course in commerce)

Accountancy (or Book Keeping and Accountancy)

**Economics** 

Business Organization (or Business management or Theory and Practice of Management)

Insurance (or General Insurance or Life Insurance)

Banking and Trade

Commercial Geography

Office Management and Secretarial Practice (or Office Organization and Management)

Mercantile Law (or any Company Law)

Auditing

Typewriting and Stenography/Computers (for typewriting).

- (b) +2 Examination or B.A. Part-I (Old Scheme) of Panjab University with at least two of the subjects mentioned in (a) securing at least 50% marks in aggregate;
- (c) +2 examination or B.A. Part-I/B.Sc.-I/Pre-Engineering/Pre-Medical Examination of the Panjab University under the Old Scheme not covered in (b) securing at least 50% marks.
- (d) Any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent to (a) or (b) or (c) as given above with requisite percentage of marks given under each clause.

Provided that a candidate seeking admission to the first semester of B.Com. should have passed in the subject of English at the +2 examination and in cases where passing in English is not necessary according to the regulations of certain Boards/Bodies/Councils/Universities in India, the admission of the candidate shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after he has cleared the subject of English as a deficient subject from the parent Board/Body/Council/University in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission. In case a candidate does not clear the relevant subject at any of the two consecutive chances allowed to him/her subsequent to the date of his/her admission his/her provisional admission to the course shall stand cancelled.

#### Provided further that:

A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by a Board/Bodies/Councils/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of B.Com. course, provided he/she fulfills the following conditions:

(i) He/she should have been placed compartment in one subject only;

- (ii) He/She should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he/she had been placed in compartment; and
- (iii) He/She should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of the examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.

The admission of the candidate with a compartment as indicated above shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after he has cleared the compartment in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission. In case the candidate does not clear the compartment at any of the two consecutive chances allowed to him/her subsequent to the date of his/her admission his/her provisional admission to the course shall stand cancelled.

- (B) Subject to the reservation made by the University, the admission shall be on merit. The merit for this purpose shall be determined on the basis of the score of a candidate to be computed as follows:
  - (i) Percentage of marks in the qualifying examination;
  - (ii) Add score of 4 for each of the subjects passed from the subjects referred in 3.1 A (a) not exceeding 16 in total.

Explanation: In cases of a compartment candidate, eligibility shall be determined by including the marks of the subject in which the candidate has been placed under compartment.

NOTE: The candidates securing less than 20% marks in the subject of compartment at the +2 examination would be made eligible to join B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Part-I courses, if they cleared or secure 20% or more marks in the subject in the Supplementary Examination held in July/August, on or before the last date for admission with late fee with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor, provided the seat/s is/ are available (Syndicate para 43 (xiv) meeting held on 27-01-2013).

### 7. ADMISSIONTO POST-GRADUATE COURSES:

(A) The admission will be made strictly in order of merit. For admission to M.A -1st semester in case the College/Departments decide to hold Entrance Tests at their level, the following procedure will be followed besides the rules/Regulations of Panjab University governing eligibility, in a particular subject.

### (B) ADMISSION CRITERIA FOR M.Sc. (IT) (Semester System Course):-

The Semester System be implemented in all the courses at Postgraduate level in the University and affiliated Colleges w.e.f. 2011-12 (Amended Syndicate Para 35 dated 30-4-2011)

### (C) ADMISSIONTO P.G.D.C.A. (Semester System):

(i) Graduate (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.C.A. under 10+2+3 System of examination) having Mathematics as main subject up to 10+2 level.

Or

(ii) B.E./B.Tech.

Or

(iii) Any other examination recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (i) or (ii) above.

### 8. MIGRATION/DEFICIENT SUBJECT(S):-

A candidate who has passed his/her 1st Semester and 2nd Semester of B.A/B.Sc. (General)/B.Com./ B.B.A./B.C.A. Course conducted by another University/College affiliated to another university in India under specific authorization by the University concerned, would be allowed to migrate to a college affiliated to this University/Department of Evening Studies/University School of Open Learning in the 3rd semester/5th semester of the respective course (as per rules prescribed under Chapter XIV -'Migration of Students' Page 247 to 262 of P.U. Calendar Volume-III, 2009) on the condition that such a candidate will have to clear the deficient subject if any, within the permissible chances.

Deficiencies should be determined by the Principal/Chairperson at the time of admission under intimation to University (i.e on the Registration Return and examination forms) as well as to the students as per University rule No.6 given at page 261 of P.U. Cal. Vol.-III, 2009

## 9. INFORMATION REGARDING COMPARTMENT CANDIDATES OF OTHER UNIVERSITIES:-

- (a) A student of any other University who is placed in compartment in 1st year/ 2nd year of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./BCA/BBA Course should not be allowed to join the 2nd year/3rd year Course of this University.
- (b) Compartment Candidates of +2 Examination seeking admission to first degree level running parallel utility oriented certificate / Diploma /Advances Diploma and add-on Courses Programme along with B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./BCA/BBA Part-I Course:

With a view to vocationalize the education at first-degree level during 10th plan period, parallel utility-oriented certificate/Diploma/Advanced Diploma Programs have been introduced. The candidates who are placed in compartment in + 2 examination having been admitted provisionally to B.A/B.Sc./B.Com. Part-I Class shall also be condidered to have been admitted provisionally in these courses. The eligibility requirements and Regulations/Rules for certificate/Diploma/Advanced Diploma Courses sanctioned by the U.G.C. under Career Orientation Programme to various affiliated Colleges from the admissions of 2004 as Add-On Courses for B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (Semester System) (1st, 2nd and 3rd) will be same as for admission to B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Course (Semester System).

#### 10. IMPORTANT NOTE:

(i) Panjab University Calendar Volume-I, II and III which contains Rules and Regulations are available at the University website www.puchd.ac.in. The amendments/ additions/certain deletion/Rules/Regulations for newly introduced courses which have been sent to the Govt. of India for approval are also available on the University web site. (ii) The rules incorporated in the instructions are subject to the over-riding the relevant regulations and rules contained in the Panjab University Calendars as also the resolutions adopted by the Syndicate. In case of any inconsistency between what is said in instructions and that in the Calendar (Regulations & Rules etc.), the provisions of Calendar shall prevail; if it is rule latest Syndicate decision shall prevail.

### One Girl Child Out Of The Only Two Girl Children

- Two additional seats per unit per course subject to maximum limit of four (4) out of the two girl children from the session 2015-16 are created for admission to a given course in the Panjab University Teaching Departments, Regional centres and its affiliated colleges provided they are otherwise eligible from all angles. The additional seats will be only for those girl children with no male sibling, The additional seat will be available to only one of the two girl children of a couple.
- 2. An affidavit on a stamp paper worth Rs. 20/- duty attested by 1st class Magistrate, to be obtained from the parents of the girls children declaring therein that the benefit of this scheme is being claimed for only one girl child out of the two girl children and the parent shall not claim the same for the 2nd girl child elsewhere in future. The specimen of the affidavit is enclosed.

#### Cancer, Aids And Thalassemia:

- 1. One additional seat each for the student suffering from Cancer, AIDS and Thalassemia has been allowed for admission in each course in the Panjab University Teaching Departments, Regional Centres and its affiliated colleges subject to the condition that the candidate seeking admission under each of these categories if otherwise eligible from all angles. <u>The claimant candidate will have to submit a certificate as a pro 1 of from the National Medical Institute like PGI, AIIMS etc. in support of his/her claim.</u>
- 2. The claimant candidate will have to submit a certificate as a proof from the national Medical Institute like PGI, AIIMS, etc in support if his/her claim.

The benefit of additional seats under the aforesaid categories will not be admissible to the students seeking admission in the courses falling under regulatory agencies such as <u>MCI, DCI, BCI and NCTE.</u>

### Two Additional Seats For Rural Area Students

1. Only those candidates will be considered in this category, which have passed their Matriculation and +2 examination from those rural schools that do not fall in the area of the Municipal Corporation/Municipal Committee/Small town/Notified Area. Further, the candidates should have been studying in such school for atlest five years before passing the last examination. A candidate claiming such benefit will have to produce a certificate from the D.E.O./Principal of the concerned institute of the area certifying that the school from where the candidate has passed the Matriculation and +2 examination, falls within the aforesaid rural area.

### One Additional Seat For Border Area Students

The border area students shall mean those candidates who have passed their matriculation and +2 examination from the Border area schools situated within 20 kilometers from the International border. A cándidate claiming such benefits will have to produce a certificate from the Tehsildar or the Principal/Headmaster/Head of the school certifying that the School from where the candidate has passed the Matriculation or +2 examination, falls within the aforesaid Border Area.

## MIGRATION I

- The followinng categories of students of B.A./B. Sc./B.Com./BCA Course of Panjab University are allowed to join the college on submission of college leaving certificate obtained from the college which they last attended within the jurisdiction of Panjab Univeresity.
  - a) Candidates who are placed under compartment.
  - b) Candidates who complete the prescribed course of lectures or non-fulfilment of the condition of securing required percentage of marks in the House Examination.
- A student migrating from a college affiliated to Punjabi University, Patiala, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, Kurukshetra University, Himachal Pradesh University is to produce within a fortnight of his admission 2. the following documents:
  - a) i) A migration certificate from the University concerned.
    - ii) The lower examination passing certificate.
    - iii) Lecture statement from the college he/she migrates.
  - b) Migration from a professional college he / she migrates.
  - c) The migration shall only be allowed if the applicant is eligible for admission to the course under the Panjab University.
  - d) When the migration has been allowed, a student must join the college within 15 days, otherwise the migration shall be automatically cancelled.

### ADMISSION OF GIRL STUDENTS

Girl students are admitted to Arts, Science Commerce, BCA and M.A. classes. All the facilities have been provided for them in a separate girls common room with a lady attendant. The lady- Dean Girls Students wellfare imparts them training in conduct, good manners, decency by giving them lectures from time to time. Every arrangment has been made for the security of the girl students

# RULES FOR PAYMENT OF COLLEGE DUES

- Every student will have to make full payment of dues at the time of admission. No part payment of dues is 1. allowed.
- Cheques and bank drafts will not be accepted. 2.
- Fees once paid shall not be refunded. 3.
- Tuition fee from May to Oct. 2018 & other monthly charges of University/ Board/ College will be payable at the 4. time of admission.
- Dates for payment of college dues (quarterly) are fixed and announced by the office from time to time. 5.
- Students unable to pay their dues on the due date may apply to the Principal for extension of the date of 6. payment. Such applications should reach the Principal three days before the due date.
- A fine of Rs. 1/- per day will be charged for the late payment of dues. 7.
- Names of the defaulters on account of non payment of dues will be struck off. A student whose name is struck 8. off may be re-admitted with the permission of the Principal on payment of Rs. 150/ as readmission fee and a late fee fine of Rs. 1/-per day counted from the due date upto the last day of the month in which the fee is paid.
- The students absent or on leave from college must arrange to pay their dues on the due dates. 9.
- 10. Fresh admission fee of Rs. 150/- and University Registration fee of 40/-will be charged if is not reimbursed by the Panjab Government.

NOTE:

- Annual/monthly charges may be revised by the University/Board/College. 1.
- No tuition fee will be charged from the eligible Scheduled caste /Backward class students who are residents of Punjab only. However, science fee will be charged if it is not reimbursed by the Panjab Government.

### FINES AND LEAVE RULES

#### FINES:

- Absence per period 1/-1.

- Absence from Practical group, Tutorial group and Composition group per day 1/-3.

- Student's Duplicate Identity Card 100/-5. The fine list will be put on the Notice Board three days before the due date for payment of fee. Any objection in this connection should be made to the Principal within two days of notification of the final list. No objection will be entertained after the explry of the period.

#### **LEAVE RULES:**

- Leave should be personally got sanctioned before it is availed of. 1.
- Reason and the date of leave must be stated clearly on the prescribed form. 2.
- Leave for more than two days will be granted by the Principal on the recommendation of tutor concerned. 3.
- Leave upto two days will be sanctioned by the Chief Tutor concerned on recommendation of the tutor. 4.
- Students who absent themselves from the college on the days immediately proceeding or following Winter/ 5. Autumn Vacation without previously having obtained permission are liable to a special fine of Rs. 5/- per day. Leave for such days, if unavoidable, must be applied for in time and permission obtained from the Principal.
- Cases of students absenting themselves from the examinations without leave are dealt with according to rules 6. governing examination. Such leave applications must reach the Principal before the examination.
- All applications for sick- leave should be accompanied by a Medical Certificate issued by a Registered Medical 7; Practitioner.
- Students must pay their dues before proceeding on leave. 8.
- All leave applications should be deposited in the office on the day the leave is granted. 9.
- Absence from the college without permission will not be entertained as an excuse for non-payme dues in time.

Concession in fee is granted to poor and deserving students. The application for the fee concession should be made on printed form available from the office as and when notified by the Principal. The applicants for fee concession, will be interviewed by a staff committee appointed by the principal and the names of such students as are granted fee concession will be notified. No fee concession will be given to one of the real brothers/ sisters studying in the college as matter of right and each case will be considered on its own merit.

Besides clothes, books etc are given to the students from students' aid fund (S. A. F.) Stipends and other financial assistance available to students are withdrawn if a student enjoying them fails in the house examination or is irregular in his/her studies or is guilty of misconduct.

#### **SCHOLARSHIPS:-**

The government, University, Military, Scheduled and Backward class Scholarships are available in the college.

#### STIPENDS :-

To encourage the really brilliant and deserving students in the various faculties, a number of stipends have been generously instituted by public spirited men of area.

### NATIONAL LOAN SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME :-

National loan Scholarship is awarded by Government of India to the needy meritorious students of Indian Nationality for study in India who secure fifty percent marks in the University/ Board examination and income of whose parents (inculuding his own income) does not exceed Rs. 25000/ -per annum. Loan is given without surety but interest is charged in case of default in re-payment. The maximum amount of loan which can be sanctioned for the students pursuing B.A., B. Com., or B. Sc. course is Rs. 720/- Per year. Loan will be sanctioned for one academic year and payment will be made to the scholar in monthly instalments by the Principal. Loan will be available, upto the course subject to good conduct and regularity in attendance. Its renewal will be made on the basis of progress report to be submitted by the Principal.

As per P.U. Chandigarh Rules, the students are required to obtain at least 25% marks in aggregate in the HOUSE EXAMINATIONS house examination during the Academic Session/Semester in order to be eligible to appear in the University/Board examination.


# RULES ABOUT HOUSE EXAMINATION

- Students absenting themselves from the examination without permission shall be fined Rs. 50/- per subject. 1.
- During examination, leave on account of illness can be granted when the application is supported by medical certificate. So far as the results are concerned, Zero mark will be awarded for absence from the examination for 2.
- Permission to be absent from the examination must ordinarily be secured before the student is to absent himself from the examination. No application for leave will be entertained after the termination of the examination.
- Students should know definitely that use of unfair means in the college examination shall, in all circumstances, be severly dealt with and the penalty will take the form of heavy fine in accordance with the seriousness of the 4. offence. Late arrival at the examination may be punshed with fine or even refusal of admission to the examination
- Fee concessions and stipends to students will invariably be revised on the basis of results in the college house examination. Those who fail in one or more subjects are liable to forfeit the concession they enjoy.

### THE COLLEGE LIBRARY

The College has a well- equipped library which provides a variety of facilities to the students and teachers. The library is housed in a magnificent double- storey building and has 40,000 books on its racks. A number of magazines and Newspapers are subscribed to. The open shelf system facilitates the students to have an easy access to books. Brilliant, poor and deserving students are issued books for the whole session. New books are added after regular intervals to keep the stock upto-date.

The college library Is equipped computers, e-lectures, audio- visual aids and with the latest non- book material to make the process of learning easier and more effective. The library has also recently been furnished with new furniture for the comfort of the students. The students of different classes and staff are issued books as under:



# RULES FOR THE ISSUE OF BOOKS

- i) The books may be retained by the students for a period of 14 days after which they must be returned or got re-issued, the latter depending upon the discretion of the Librarian.
- ii) A fine of one rupee per day, per volume is charged if the book is not returned by the due date.
- Reference books, text-books and rare- books, are not issued to the students and can only be read or consulted in the library.
- iv) If a student loses, defaces or damages a book, he/she shall be liable to pay the cost of it or replace the book along with the late return fine, if any.
- v) Current issues of the periodicals and newspapers are not issued.
- vi) If a student disturbs the peaceful atmosphere of the library by making a noise, the librarian has the discretion to ask the student to leave the library building.
- vii) The library will be closed once a year for the purpose of stock checking. All the books borrowed from the library must be returned as notified by the Librarian/Principal.
- viii) The librarian reserves the right of recalling a book whenever he thinks it necessary.
- ix) Library card must be produced at the time of getting the roll number and the refund of library securities.

#### **300K BANK SECTION**

The College library has facility of book bank for meritorious and the needy students. Books are issued from the Book Bank to the deserving students for the full session.

#### DENTITY- CUM- LIBRARY CARD

From the Academic Session 2015-16, the College has the provision of PVC ID-cum-Library Card to each student with barcode facility for their record in computer.

All the students admitted to the college are issued identity- cum- library card at the time of their admission. The purpose of this is to inculcate in the students—the habit of maintaining their diary as also to provide them with all information about the College. The Student's diary also contains the photograph of the student and serves as an identity card. This card includes the library, college rules and blank pages for the issue of library books. In view of the above facts, full care of safety—of the identity- cum- library card should be taken. If it is lost a duplicate card is issued at the discretion of the college librarian/ Principal after establishing a complete identification and genuineness of the student. It should be handed over to anybody else lest it should—be misused. The owner is responsible for all the consequences occurring therefrom. All the students of the College—are directed to collect their identity-cum-Library card after submission of their library membership forms along with passport size photograph.

Every student is required to keep identity-cum-library card with him/ her while in the college. If a student is found without it on any occasion, he/ she will be fined by the principal.

#### ATTENTION TO AVERAGE STUDENTS

Being situated in a small town, the college is fed by students hailing from rural areas. As such the college gets students with average standard of awareness and intelligence. But special attention is paid to raise the level of these students so as to enable them to compete with the students of big cities.

## CARE FOR BRILLIANT STUDENTS

The brilliant students joining the college also get special and extra attention. The enlightened and highly qualified staff of the college takes extra pain to run special coaching classes for such students. Further such students can always have an easy access to their teachers and discuss their problems freely with them. Tutorial groups are formed for commerce classes and in their tutorial periods such brilliant students get the personal attention of the teachers and can get the same facility in composition groups where the number of students is very small and so they can discuss their problems with their teachers in a more congenial and free atmosphere.

The college provides a wide range of concessions to the students distinguishing themselves either in academic sphere or in the field of sports or extra moral activities. The poor and deserving students also do not go unaided and are granted fee concessions. Some deserving students are given stipends and scholarships from the student aid fund.

The college does not provide merely academic knowledge to the students but it also aims at character building. The real objective of education is over-all development of personality, cultural and moral upliftment and grooming human beings to make them cultured and enlightened. Thus special emphasis is laid on character-building activities. The students are made to imbibe the qualities of discipline, dedication to duty and patriotism.

## **CURBING RAGGING IN INSTITUIONS**

It has been impressed upon by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India that relating to admission of the students in any educational institution if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if his/her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority can expel him/her from the institution.

### ADDITIONAL SEAT FOR GIRL CHILD AND CANCER / AIDS / THALASSEMIA PATIENT:

- There is provision for an additional seat for the single girl child for admission to a given course in the Panjab University provided she is otherwise eligible from all angles. THE RESERVATION IN FAVOUR OF THE GIRL CHILD WHETHER A SINGLE GIRL OR ONE AMONGST TWO OR EVEN WITH NO MALE CHILD MAY BE EXTENDED TO ONE OF THE GIRLS OF A COUPLE.

### **RULES FOR CYCLE/ SCOOTER/CAR PARKING**



- 6. Students are advised to not to place their cycles/scooters in front of railway gate of the college. A heavy fine will be imposed on the student who places his scooter/cycle/ motorcycle in front of railway gate of the college.


